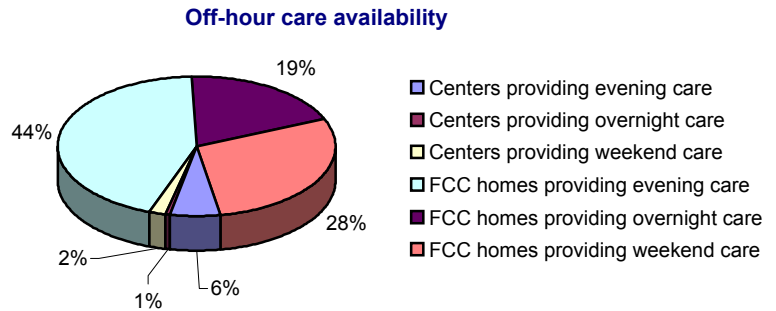
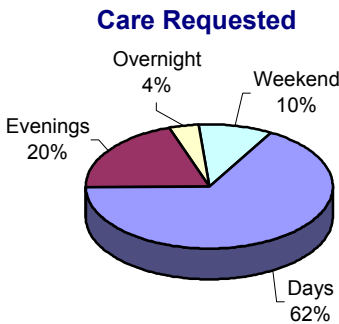
Capacity by Type of Care

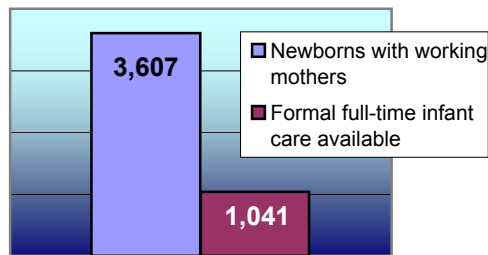

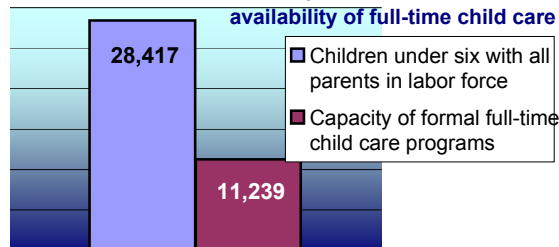

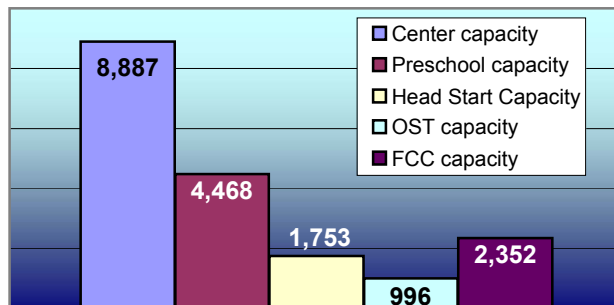

Capacity by Type of Care

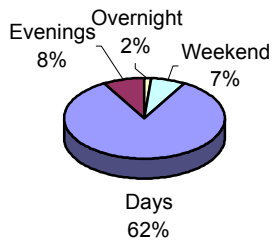

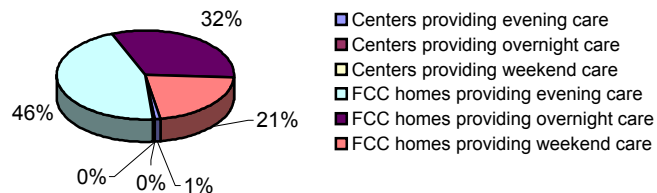

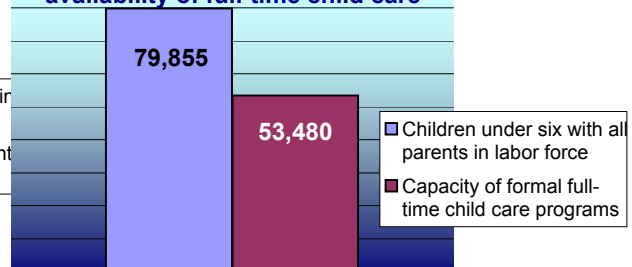

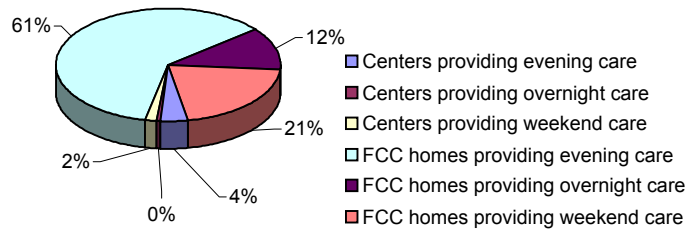

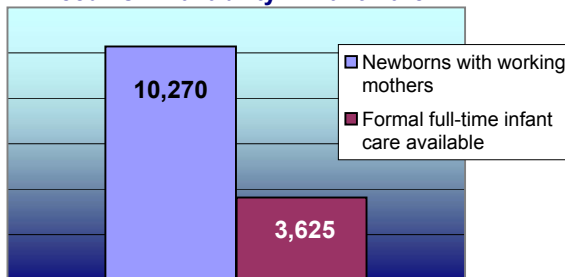

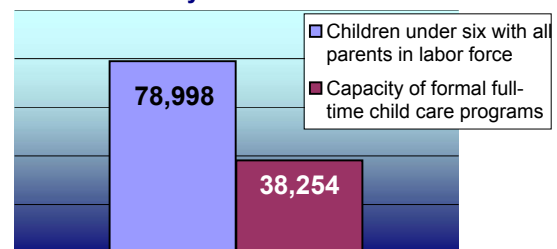

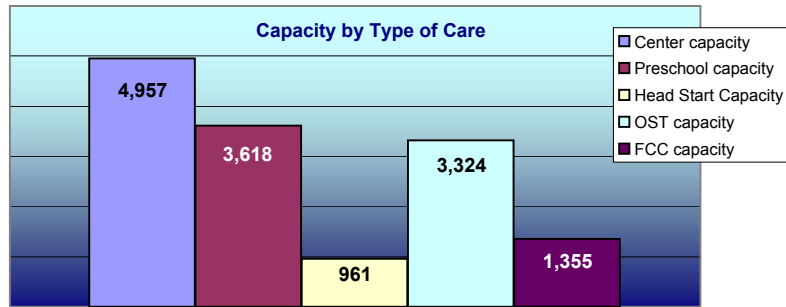

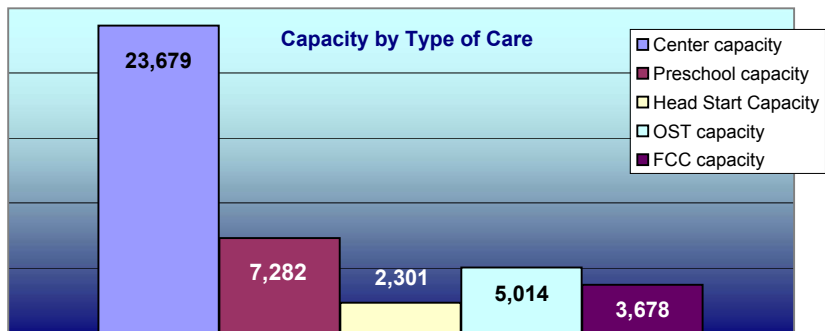

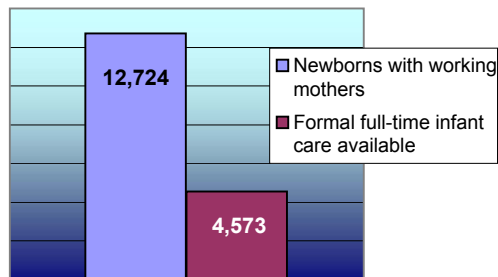

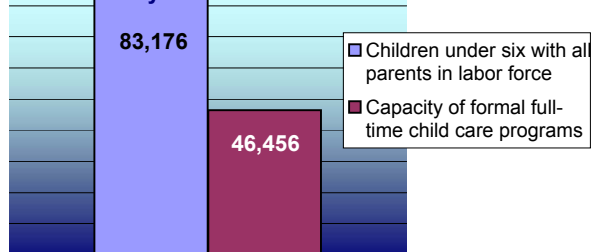

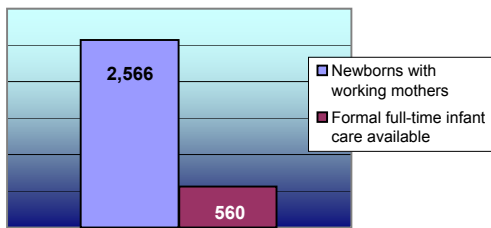

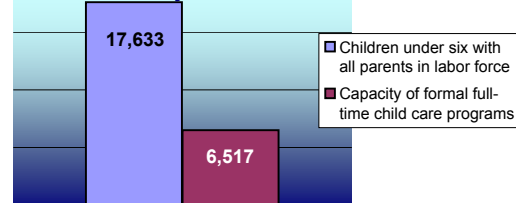

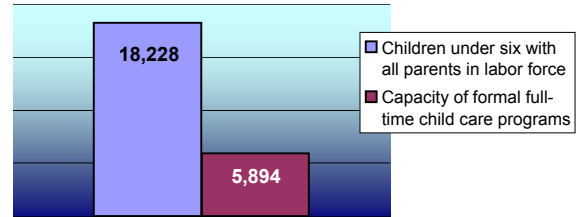

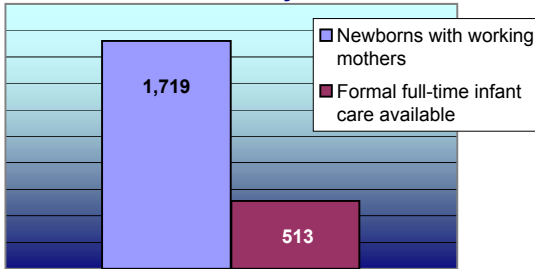

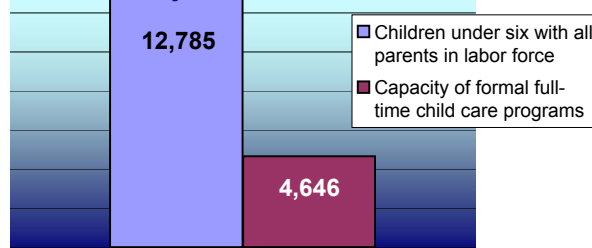

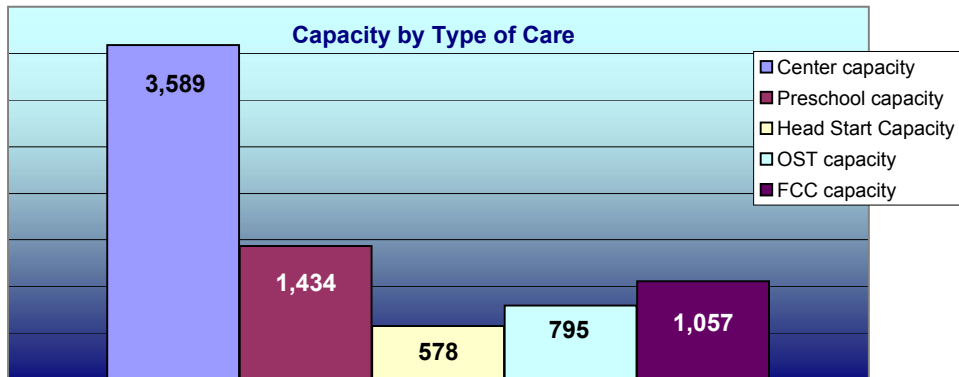

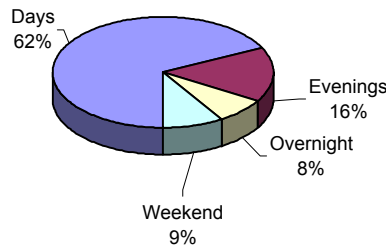

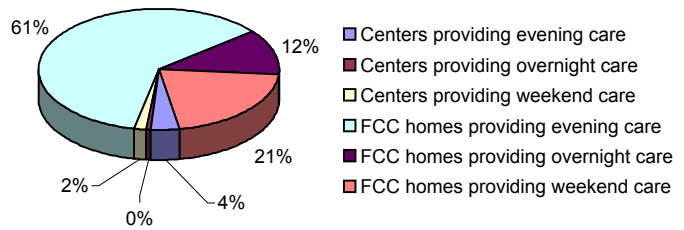

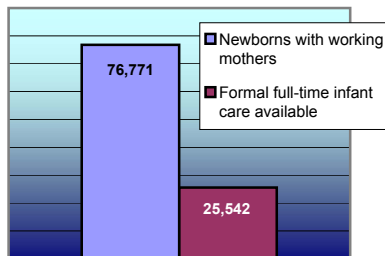

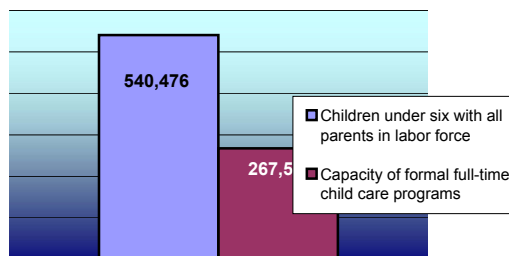

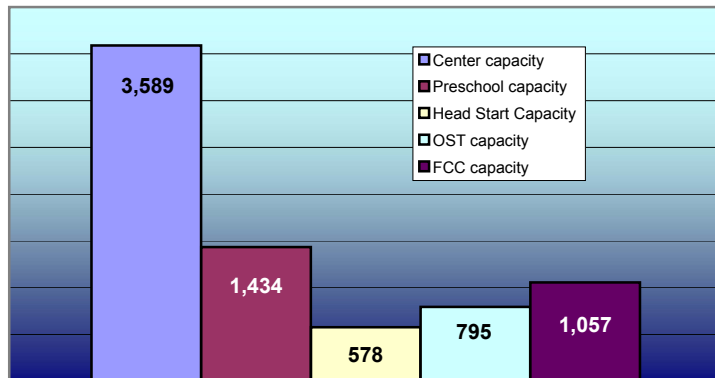

Capacity by Type of Care

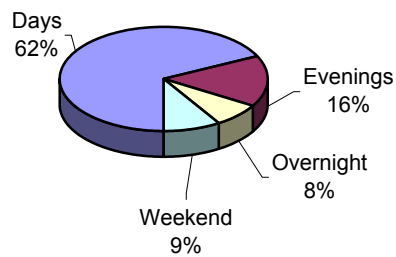
